### F. ACTION ITEMS:

1. RESOLUTION APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE EDEN PARK SERVICE AREA BOARD – RESOLUTION 21-2015

Brooke Stewart, of the Commission Office, stated that the terms of the current chair, Nicholas A. Froerer, and vice chair, Mindi L. Quinn, had expired. This item was noticed and published according to State statute and four applications were received.

Commissioner Ebert moved to adopt Resolution 21-2015 reappointing Nicholas A. Froerer and Mindi L. Quinn to the Eden Park Service Area Board through 12/31/2018; Commissioner Bell seconded.

#### RESOLUTION APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE LIBERTY PARK SERVICE AREA BOARD - RESOLUTION 22-2015

Brooke Stewart, of the Commission Office, stated that the five board members' terms expired. Ten applications were received and Commissioner Bell noted that they were husbands and the wives. Commissioner Ebert moved to adopt Resolution 22-2015 appointing Ross Mertlich and Kevin Phipps to 2-year terms; Brett Hansen, Michael Rhodes, and Sharmain Kennedy-Croft to 4-year terms on the Liberty Park Service Area Board; Commissioner Bell seconded. Commissioner Ebert – aye; Commissioner Bell – aye

3. Real Estate contract for the sale of property located at 701 W. 12<sup>th</sup> Street to the State of Utah, Division of Facilities & Construction Management, for a Youth Center – Contract C2015-55

Kevin McLeod, of County Operations, stated that it has been a long process to sell the property to the State for the Juvenile Detention Center. Major contract changes include increasing the selling price from the original proposed amount by the State of \$1.09 million to \$1.225 million due to a reevaluation of the property, and increasing the \$150,000 that the State originally proposed as its participation amount for the construction of the new roadway off 12<sup>th</sup> Street (the new east entrance road) to \$250,000.

Commissioner Bell noted that the county purchased the property over a year ago as part of the plan for the State to build the youth detention center, and that it was also to help Marriott Slaterville City (for a business that needed to come in). This resulted in the need for a land swap.

Mr. McLeod noted that there has been some question as to why the county would sell property purchased for over \$2 million for \$1.225 million and explained that this transaction is for only about 7.5 acres of the 11 acres. Commissioner Bell concurred, and he stated that the 12<sup>th</sup> Street frontage is still in the county's name. Chris Allred, County Attorney, had no questions or comments. Commissioner Ebert noted that the Youth Center's concept is for consolidation of services, which is not the current practice. He supports the planned consolidation.

Commissioner Ebert moved to approve Contract C2015-55 for sale of property located at 701 W. 12<sup>th</sup> Street to the State of Utah, Division of Facilities and Construction Management, for a Youth Center; Commissioner Bell seconded.

George Hall, RAMP Chair, acknowledged the great contributions from the Clerk/Auditor's Office, (i.e., the compliance audit report), the County Attorney's Office, Shelly Halacy of the Commission Office and Holin Wilbanks, Weber County RAMP Liaison. Mr. Hall explained the process for application review for the funding requests and noted that matching funds from other sources have a tremendous impact in funding great projects. He presented the list of grant recommendations stating that the committees recognize that these are sacred tax dollars approved by the voters.

Commissioner Bell stated that as of the end of 2014 almost \$26 million have been spent thus far for RAMP projects in our community. Ms. Wilbanks gave an overview of RAMP, a one cent tax on every \$10 spent in the county that generates about \$3 million for projects in our community. She explained how the funding is allocated. Commissioner Ebert noted that RAMP acts autonomously from the county in accounting influences, and it is a very clean process.

Jeanie Hall, with RAMP, noted that this is the final year that Meg Nesbitt will serve and expressed appreciation for Ms. Nesbitt's incredible leadership and organizational processes that she has helped the RAMP Board to develop. The commissioners and Mr. Hall echoed those sentiments. The commissioners expressed appreciation to the committees for all of their hard work.

Commissioner Ebert moved to approve the request by the Weber County Recreation, Arts, Museums and Parks Board for approval of the 2015 grant recommendations; Commissioner Bell seconded. Commissioner Ebert – aye; Commissioner Bell – aye

### **G. Public Comments:**

Doug Hansen, of West Weber, spoke about the Little Weber cut-off project for flood mitigation. He said that he found out new information this past week that changed the calculations that he had come up with previously. He has been speaking to this item for weeks but had not been aware that at the end of this canal there is a water dam, which means water going into it leaves slower and can be held up, which also means the project requires a larger facility/cement canal. He said that originally the design of this canal was to be 10 feet deep and had a dam at its end because the bottom of the canal would be lower than the Little Weber channel into which it was to flow, and that he now understands it had to be redesigned to 8 feet. He said that the amount of changes depends on how this is calculated and that he submitted one alternative to the County Engineer this morning to see if it is of value and if a design change is possible. He wants to meet/work with county staff on details of this situation. Commissioner Ebert noted that as Mr. Hansen has come to the commissioners with concerns they have contacted the engineers and that it appears they have provided him with some answers as to how to address those concerns. They continue to listen and have open dialogue.

Larry Hansen, of Warren, said that there was a presentation (on 2/17/2015) on the Ogden Bay Waterfowl Management Area Habitat Management Plan and the county was praised for its contributions to rehabilitation, however, the county came onto his property and destroyed more than half of his duck nests in 2013. During the study his property had shown to have 30 times more wood ducks hatch than Ogden Bay. He said that the county has not fulfilled its promise to put back what it had destroyed and to make him whole—this was 15 months ago. He said that Lance Peterson (of County Emergency Services) and the County Engineer both had stated that the county would rebuild and put things back, but this has not occurred. He has made several attempts to meet with the Commission, the Engineer, and Mr. Peterson but has been unsuccessful, therefore, he asked for financial compensation to be used to hire someone to put the habitat back as soon as possible.
