**E. PUBLIC COMMENTS:** Ralph Price, of Ogden, said that he lets the homeless without an address use his so that they can receive federal stimulus payments, that many people need guidance on using that money, that he would like our county to have a telethon to help those in need, and that rights of people on wheelchairs on roads need to be addressed.

**G. ACTION ITEMS:**

**1. AGREEMENT WITH CACHE VALLEY BANK ALLOWING FOR TEMPORARY WEBER CENTER PARKING ON BANK PROPERTY**

Scott Mendoza, of County Community Development, said that this contract is related to the imminent parking structure demolition project. It allows county employees and Weber Center tenants to use about 70 parking spaces across the street at the Bank's property through March 31, 2021. The bank is not requesting any remuneration only that the county provide regular minor routine maintenance. Commissioner Harvey would like to leave that area in even better condition; Commissioner Jenkins agreed noting that the Bank has been very accommodating.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve the agreement with Cache Valley Bank allowing for temporary Weber Center parking on Bank property; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

**2. FINAL APPROVAL OF PARKSIDE PRUD PHASE 2A, CONSISTING OF 12 LOTS**

Steve Burton, of the County Planning Division, stated that this is part of the Wolf Creek development in the Bridges PRUD. The Ogden Valley Planning Commission and County Planning staff recommended approval. This item includes approval of a subdivision improvement agreement for \$31,146.00.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to grant final approval of Parkside PRUD Phase 2A, consisting of 12 lots; Commissioner Harvey seconded.

**3. CONTRACT WITH EPIC ENGINEERING, P.C., FOR SWPPP INSPECTION SERVICES ENSURING COMPLIANCE TO THE STATE REGULATIONS**

Ashley Thoman, of County Engineering, stated that this contract is for inspection services to meet State regulations for erosion prevention. Proposals were received and Epic Engineering was selected. These inspections are funded through the permit fees collected. He addressed Commissioner Jenkins' question stating that it would require additional manpower for staff to perform these services and the engineering firm has the expertise and efficiency in performing these services.

Commissioner Harvey moved to approve the contract with Epic Engineering, P.C., for SWPPP Inspection Services ensuring compliance to the state regulations; Commissioner Jenkins seconded.

**H. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS:** Commissioner Jenkins said that Melissa Freigang, Prosperity Center of Excellence Director, had just emailed him stating that she is working with the State for teams to go directly to shelters to help people with taxes, to get stimulus checks to those eligible, and that they are working with Youth Futures and the street outreach to deliver mail; they are making good strides. Chair Froerer noted the need to be cognizant of water issues now that we’re moving into hot temperatures after a couple of dry springs. Commissioner Jenkins agreed and referred to Sevier County’s plight because they over allocated the aquifer water, which can cause serious issues. The 50-year old Weber Center parking structure had been slated for demolition for some time and the issues are now more serious after the recent earthquake. It has been closed since then, RFPs were issued and a firm has been selected.
