

APPROPRIATOR'S CERTIFICATE

I, E.P. Ellison, being first duly sworn, do hereby certify that I am the President of THE DAVIS & WEBER COUNTIES CANAL COMPANY, who did, on August 12-1912, make an application to appropriate water from Weber River for irrigation purposes; that said application is now on file in the State Engineer's office as No 4816 and that these drawings, maps, and profiles, consisting of 133 sheets, are submitted to accompany the written proof of appropriation pertaining thereto. That the total area of the lands in this tract to which the appropriated and stored water is applied for irrigation is 49,200.8 Acres with boundaries as shown on drawings herewith. That the lands comprised in the tract have been partially irrigated from sundry local small streams and springs beginning with the settlement of the country. Some 30 years ago THE DAVIS & WEBER COUNTIES CANAL CO. began to supply more water from the flood of Weber River through a small canal in earth. This canal was enlarged from time to time and was finally lined with concrete; it has a capacity of 425 second feet. That inasmuch as the canal company had no rights to water other than the annual spring flood waters of the river, which ceased about July 1st to 15th each year, it was necessary to supply water for later irrigation by storage. This was done by building a storage reservoir on East Canyon Creek, beginning in 1896 and increasing the capacity from time to time until the stored water for late use was 13,000 acre feet. This appropriation was made to add 15,000 acre feet to the capacity to make a total supply of 28,000 acre feet of stored water. That all the water supplies mentioned, when combined, are still insufficient to irrigate the entire tract.

That it has been a custom from the first, well and firmly established by usage to the present, to use the water available on different land on different years; the water has never been regarded as pertinent to any particular piece of land; much water is leased annually by owners of water-shares to land owners and renters who own no rights to water. This applies to water from all sources.

That it is consequently, not practical to make a change in old established customs of using water

on this tract of land by defining the actual land on which the water will be used. That all the water supply may be used any part of the tract. The land in the tract cannot be all irrigated the same year until an additional supply may be provided.
