

General Description of the land occupied

This land is located about 2 miles North of the town of Croyden, on East Creek, in Sec. 9, T³ 4, R. 4 E. The land is agricultural in character. The western half being cultivated with alfalfa and potatoes. The Croyden irrigation ditch runs southerly through this claim. The entire claim is fenced with a wire fence. ~~The eastern part is irrigated from the Croyden ditch and is therefore uncultivated.~~

From personal inquiry among reputable ~~residents~~ consists contains an area of 19 acres.

Description of the Claim of
Jacob and Elizabeth Mole.

This claim ~~consists~~ is a tract of agricultural land of 200 acres in area, and lies in Secs 4, 8, 9. The greater part of which is cultivated with alfalfa and garden products. Jacob Mole and Elizabeth Mole, husband and wife reside upon this claim, and their improvements consist of houses, cow sheds and pens, outhouses and stables and fences. The eastern part of the land is covered with cottonwood. The western boundary follows the foothills at the West side, East Creek Canon. A spring rises near the Mole residence, used for water use and to irrigate garden. The land is irrigated from East Creek by a small irrigating ditch.

General Description of the
Claims of John Hopkins.

1st Cedar Canon Claim. This claim occupies all the available land ~~in~~ occupying in the mouth of Cedar Canon, and extends ~~5/8~~ ^{1/4} mile in length, and is cultivated with alfalfa. The soil is average about 3rd and 4th rate, is irrigated directly from Cedar Creek, which runs westerly in said Canon. There is a log house on the said land ~~but not occupied as a residence.~~

2nd East Creek Claim is only that part 1st of a large tract of land occupied by John Hopkins which lies in Sec. 3, and is mostly cultivated with alfalfa, and is irrigated by an irrigating ditch taken out of East Creek. The soil is 3rd and 4th rates.
