of monumtstones in the roads in the vicinity of Hesper; and It was Ordered, That a road bounded and described as follows be, and the same is hereby designated as, and declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

Description of a section of the County Road 8 rods in width leading Westward and Southward from Riverdale District to Danne County.

Beginning at a point in the center of said road 19.50 chains due East from the center of Section No. 13, in Township No. 5 North, Range Two West of the Salt Lake Meridian running from thence due West 19.50 chains, to the center of said Section, thence South 29.79 chains, to the intersection of the center of a road four rods in width leading from Hesper District, which point of intersection is designated by a sandstone monument numbered 58. From this point the following bearings were observed: to Observatory Peak N. 71° 00' E, to Ben Lomond Pk. N. 13° 23' E, and to Cyrie Pk. N. 33° 41' E. Thence continuing due South 11.11 chains, to the intersection of the center of the road as previously located. June 20, 1881.

And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that a portion of a certain County Road bounded as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the center of the said road, 19.50 chains due East from the center of Section No. Thirteen (13), Township No. Five (5) North, Range Two (2) West, Salt Lake Meridian, running from thence S. 29° 53' N. 39.28 chains, to the West line of the South East Quarter of the above named Section; is no longer needed for public use,

It was Ordered, That the said portion of said road be, and it hereby is abandoned.

Judge Shuntliff stated to the Court that the Committee on Streets representing the City Council of Ogden City had informed him that the City Council are desirous of having the County designate Fifth Street in Ogden City as a County Road for the purpose of working poll tax thereon, & improving the street. The matter was duly considered, &

It was Ordered, by the Court that that portion of Fifth Street in Ogden City bounded and described as follows, be, and the same is hereby designated as, and declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

Beginning in the center of Main Street in Ogden City at a point 13.36 chains S. 0° 25' N. from what is known as Weber County Survey Monument No. 1, running from thence N. 89° 35' N. 35.76 chains, in the center of Fifth Street to the West line of what is known as Mill Street, in Ogden City.

G. A. Anderson Esq, County Superintendent of District Schools, stated to the Court that the financial reports of the County Clerk on file in his office, show

That during the fiscal year ending May 31st, 1882, A. Anderson, Poind Neepes, paid into the

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 3rd
 day of October A. D. 1888 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 on page 456 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

It was ordered by the Court that all that portion of Fifth Street, bounded and described as follows, be, and the same is hereby designated as and declared to be a County Road, to-wit: -

Beginning in the center of Main Street in Ogden City ^{at a point} 3.36 chains S. 0° 15' W. from what is known as Weber County Survey Monument No. 1, running from thence N. 89° 35' W. 35.76 chains, in the center of Fifth Street, to the West Line of what is known as Wall Street, in Ogden City.
