negotiating with them for three or four different routes for the road, the Committee finally agreed, unanimously, that the best interests of the County would be served by purchasing a strip of land four rods in width, North and South, and 16 rods in length, East and West, extending through and across the land of William Hill, for the purpose of continuing the road leading through Hansville on a straight line through the entire premises of William Hill to connect with the County Road running North and South on the West side of Mr. Hill's premises; accordingly the County Surveyor was instructed to make a survey of the land agreed upon for this piece of road, and upon his return of the proper description to the Clerk and a proper deed thereof executed by Mr. Hill and delivered to the County therefor the sum of \$125⁰⁰ was paid to Mr. Hill by the Clerk, by order of the Committee as full compensation for the land purchased, for the removal of the improvements now upon the land, and for all services rendered by him in clearing the land and opening the street for public travel.

The report was accepted, the action of the Committee approved and confirmed, the sum of \$125⁰⁰ was appropriated to Mr. Hill as compensation for the land and services reported by the Committee, an appropriation of \$8⁰⁰ was made to County Surveyor Jenkins and assistants for making a survey of the premises, \$3⁰⁰ was appropriated to Selectman McQuarrie and \$5⁰⁰ to Selectman Green for services rendered on said Committee, and \$2⁰⁰ to C. C. Richards for horse and buggy furnished for the use of the Committee, and it was Ordered that a road bounded and described as follows be, and the same is hereby designated as and declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

Description of a section of a road four rods in width situated in the Northern part of Hooper District, in Weber County, Utah:

Beginning at the center of the road near William Hill's residence in Hooper at the South East corner of Section No. Six (6), Township No. Five (5) North, Range Two (2) West, Salt Lake Meridian, running from thence S. 89° 45' N. 41.06 chains, to the West line of the South East Quarter of said Section No. Six, thence South 24.40 chains, to the intersection of the center of the road previously located July 10, 1884, from Hooper Northward.

Selectman McQuarrie also reported that while at Hansville a few days ago he had satisfactorily arranged with the Road Supervisor of the Hansville District to have the crossing near the ^{Hooper switch on the} Denver and Rio Grande Railway changed to suit the new

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 28th
 day of October A. D. 1884 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 on page 463 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

In the Northern part of Hooper District:-
 Beginning at the center of the road near William
 Hull's residence in Hooper at the southeast corner of Section
 No. 6, Township 5 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian
 running from thence S. 89° 45' W. 41.06 chains, to the
 west line of the Southeast Quarter of said Section No. 6
 thence South 24.40 chains, to the intersection of
 the center of the road previously located, July 10. '84.
