

RECORD OF THE COUNTY COURT OF WEBER COUNTY, UTAH TERRITORY.

1886

April 12

Mr. Wallace reported that, pursuant to instructions received from the Court on March 15, 1886, he had proceeded with the County Surveyor to Staterville and had changed the location of the County Road crossing the lot upon which the Staterville School House stands. Mr. Wallace presented a written description of the road as now located.

The report was accepted. Mr. Wallace was allowed \$41.00 for services rendered in this behalf and released from the Committee. Washington Jenkins' bill of \$15.00, for surveying the road & expenses incurred in so doing, was read and allowed. ✓

It was Ordered, That a road bounded and described as follows be and the same is hereby designated as, and declared to be, a County Road, to wit:

Beginning in the center of the street at what is known and designated as Weber County Survey Monument No. 8, situate near the Staterville Schoolhouse, thence following ^{the center of the road} South 31° 21' West 88 chains to the center of the County Road as previously located. September 18, 1884.

The bill of \$35.00 of G. A. Shaw, Constable of North Ogden Precinct, for conveying one Lewis, a criminal, from South Ogden to Ogden and for guarding said criminal was read and allowed. An appropriation of \$25.00 was made for winding County clerk for quarter ending March 31, 1886.

William Seddes, Esq., of Plain City, appeared before the Court and reported that at the time of the appointment by the Court of Hugh Seddes as District Court Clerk for Plain City Precinct, he was and now is a non-resident of this County, & Mr. Seddes suggested the name of Joseph S. Seddes for said office.

After due consideration of the matter, the report was accepted, and Joseph S. Seddes was appointed District Court Clerk for Plain City Precinct, to succeed Hugh Seddes, a non-resident.

It was Ordered by the Court that the following appropriations be made and paid out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated to wit:

County Road Book,

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 1st
 day of April A. D. 1886 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 D on page 31 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

In Platerville:-

Beginning in the center of the street at what is known and designated as Weber County Survey Monument No. 83, situated near the Platerville Schoolhouse, thence following the center of the road South $35^{\circ} 27'$ West 5.88 chains to the center of the County Road as previously located.

 — Closing a Road —

Selectman Ched reported that Selectman Shurcliff and himself had visited along the line of road from Ogden to Hooper City. The location of the road which was asked to be closed by Mr. Ritter was closely examined and the Committee recommended that said road be closed, and that a road running due East and West along the Section Line until it intersects the road which is now surveyed running west through the school Section. The report was accepted and the recommendation adopted.
