G. R. Belmont's bill of \$13.⁴⁰/₁₀₀ for boarding County prisoners was read & referred to Mr. J. C. Hawley.

Mr. A. Subring's bill of \$11.⁰⁰/₁₀₀ for keeping Mrs. Bane, a pauper, was read and allowed.

John M. Davis' bill of \$5.⁰⁰/₁₀₀ for use of teams and buggy used by Committee in inspecting County roads in Ogden Canyon, was read and allowed.

A petition signed by David Evans, of Pleasant View, in this County, was presented and read, asking for an appropriation of \$25.⁰⁰/₁₀₀ to compensate him for the loss of a mare colt which fell through a bridge over County road leading from North Ogden to Harrisville, thereby breaking its leg, which resulted in the death of the animal.

The matter was duly considered, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the claim is a just one and should be paid by the County, an appropriation of \$25.⁰⁰/₁₀₀ was made to Mr. Evans as compensation in full for all damages sustained by him on account of the loss of his said animal.

It also appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that a certain ^{road which is four rods in width and is} certain, described as follows to-wit: Beginning at a certain monument of sandstone situated in the center of what is known as Main Street, in North Ogden, one chain East and ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ of a chain South from the South East corner of Lot 48, Plat B of North Ogden Survey known and described as Weber County Survey Monument No. 1st, from which the bearing to Ben Leonard Peak is North 5° 11' East, and to Observatory Peak S 22° 49' East, running thence North 89° 41 1/2 West, along the center of said street, 113 ⁰⁰/₁₀₀ chains, to a point intersecting the East side of the road leading from Harrisville Northward and Westward to Pleasant View; is no longer needed as a public County Road.

County Road Book,

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 26
 day of July A. D. 1886 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 \$ on page 53 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a ~~County Road~~ ^{abandoned}, to-wit:

Beginning at a certain monument of sandstone situated in the center of what is known as Main Street, in North Ogden, one chain east and .50 of one chain south from the southeast corner of Lot 48, Plat B of North Ogden Survey, known and described as Weber County Survey Monument No. 14, from which the bearing to Benlamont Peak is N. $5^{\circ}14'$ E. and to Observatory Peak S. $32^{\circ}49'$ E. running thence north $89^{\circ}41\frac{1}{2}'$ West along the center of said street, 113.84 chains to a point intersecting the east side of the road leading from Haricville northward and westward to Pleasant View, is no longer needed as a public County Road, and, it is hereby ordered that said road be abandoned.
