Prayer by Mr. Green.

Minutes of the 6th inst. were read and approved.

Commissions from the Governor of Utah Territory for Lewis V. Shurtliff, as Probate Judge for the ensuing term; for Joseph Stanford, as Selectman for the full term; for Thomas Wallace, as Selectman for the unexpired term; for Charles C. Richards, as Clerk of the County Court and as Prosecuting Attorney for Weber County for the ensuing terms, were presented and examined, and the Clerk was directed to note them in the minutes of the Court.

Mr. M. Quarric, the Committee to whom was referred the petition of Willis Brown and ten others, asking to have a County Road located as follows: "Commencing at the West end of the street running through Riverdale, thence North, along the road as now traveled to or near the South West corner of Section 6, thence North along the Township line until it intersects with the road from Hooper alongside of the Utah Central Railway," reported that pursuant to instructions received from the Court, he had caused a survey to be made for a County Road, and presented the County Surveyor's written description of it to the Court, which was carefully examined, and

It was Ordered that a road bounded and described as follows be, and the same is hereby designated as, and declared to be, a County Road, to wit:

Description of a County Road four rods in width leading Northward from Riverdale School-house, to the North East corner of Section No. 36, in Township No. 6 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, N. S. Survey.

Beginning at a certain monument of sandstone known and designated as Weber County Survey Monument No. 6, situated in the center of the main County Road leading East and West through the District of Riverdale, at the intersection of the center of the road leading to South Weber District, and near the Riverdale school-house. At this point the

bearing to Observatory Peak was observed to be North $79^{\circ}04'$ East, running thence due North, in the center of said road, $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains, thence North $11^{\circ}21'$ West $4\frac{1}{100}$ chains, thence North $9^{\circ}28'$ West $13\frac{5}{100}$ chains, thence North $85^{\circ}35'$ West $4\frac{4}{100}$ chains, thence North $2^{\circ}56'$ East, $13\frac{0}{100}$ chains, thence North $26^{\circ}38'$ East $8\frac{3}{100}$ chains, thence North $21^{\circ}15'$ East $9\frac{1}{100}$ chains, to the East line of Section No. One (1), Township No. Five (5) North, Range Two (2) West, Salt Lake Meridian, thence North $39^{\circ}30''$ West $150\frac{4}{100}$ chains, along the East line of Sections No. One (1) and Thirty-Six (36), in Townships No. 5 and 6 respectively, North, Range Two (2) West, S. L. M., to a point in the center of the road leading from Ogden City to Hooper District; said point being situated $3\frac{2}{100}$ chains South $0^{\circ}39'$ East from the North East corner of Section No. 36 above described. The above road is $2\frac{6}{100}$ miles in length.

An appropriation of $\$5\frac{00}{100}$ was made to Selectman M^r. Quarrie, for services rendered with the County Surveyor in locating the above described road.

Selectman M^r. Quarrie reported to the Court that his term of office as Selectman for this County has expired; that his successor (Mr. Stanford) has been duly elected, qualified and commissioned and, as no further business remained in his hands for consideration or attention, he would withdraw from the Court.

Mr. M^r. Quarrie's report was received by the Court, and an appropriation of $\$10\frac{00}{100}$ was made to him for sundry services which have been rendered by him in providing for the purchase of necessaries for the Court House and office, and upon sundry committees, for which no compensation has heretofore been allowed.

An appropriation of $\$2\frac{20}{100}$ was made to Judge Shurtliff, for eleven days attendance on County Court and mileage from May 24th, 1886, to September 6th, 1886.

An appropriation of $\$21\frac{00}{100}$ was made to Selectman M^r. Quarrie, for eleven days attendance on County Court and mileage from May 24th, 1886, to September 6th, 1886.

An appropriation of $\$48\frac{00}{100}$ was made to Selectman Grant, for eleven days attendance on County Court and mileage from May 24th, 1886, to September 6th, 1886.

An appropriation of $\$16\frac{20}{100}$ was made to Selectman Wallace, for eleven days attendance on County Court and mileage from May 24th, 1886, to September 6th, 1886.

A petition, signed by Joseph Clark was presented and read, representing that he sustained a great loss by the burning of his mill on August 14th, 1886, asking the Court to readjust the taxes on his mill property, to make them conform to the present value of said property, or to remit back to him the overpaid portion of the same.

Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 20
 day of September A. D. 1886. (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 D on page 77 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

From Riverdale school house to Northeast
 Corner of Section 36, Township ^{No.} 6 North Range 2 West - S. L. M.
 Beginning at a certain monument of sandstone
 known and designated as Weber County Survey Monument
 No. 56, situated in the center of the main County Road
 leading east and west through the District of Riverdale,
 at the intersection of the center of the road leading to
 South Weber District, and near the Riverdale School house.
 At this point the bearing to Observatory Peak was
 observed to be $N. 79^{\circ} 04' E$ running thence due north in
 the center of said road, 3.47 chains, thence $N. 11^{\circ} 24' N.$
 4.41 chains, thence $N. 9^{\circ} 28' N.$ 12.85 chains, thence $N.$
 $85^{\circ} 35' N.$ 4.45 chains, thence $N. 2^{\circ} 56' E.$ 13 chains, thence
 $N. 26^{\circ} 38' E.$ 8.34 chains, thence $N. 21^{\circ} 15' E.$ 9.88 chains
 to the east line of Section No. 1, Township 5 North, Range
 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, thence $N. 39^{\circ} 30' N.$
 150.45 chains, along the east lines of Section 1
 and 36 in Township 5 & 6 respectively, North, Range
 2 West - S. L. M., to a point in the center of a
 road leading from Ogden to Harper, said point
 being situated 3.75 chains south $0^{\circ} 29'$ east from
 the northeast corner of section 36 above described.
 The above road is 2.62 miles in length.
