

## RECORD OF THE COUNTY COURT OF WEBER COUNTY, UTAH TERRITORY.

August 27 1889.

Sec. of the Court met pursuant to adjournment.  
 Present: or Full Board

Prayer by Mrs. Wallace

Petitions of the 21st inst. were read & approved

Mr. Shurtliff, in behalf of the Committee, reported that Judge Cross & of himself had inspected the road which Joel Terry & others complained had been closed up by David Jenkins, & after carefully investigating the matter were of the opinion that the road is a community road, & therefore recommended that the prayer of said petitioners be denied.

The report was accepted, the recommendation adopted, & the prayer of said petitioners was denied, as recommended.

A description of a section of County Road known as 4th Street West of Ogden City, was presented by George Jenkins, and after due consideration,

It was decided, that all that part of the County Road leading from Ogden City Westward & South Westward to Hope City, previously located & recorded, lying & being within lines drawn parallel to & 32 feet distant on each side of the following described line, to-wit:

beginning at a point 5<sup>00</sup> chains South 72° 21' West & 5<sup>50</sup> chains South 80° 27' West from Weber Convey. <sup>Survey</sup> Monument No 61, passing thence South 80° 27' West 3<sup>46</sup> chains, thence North 72° 21' West 9<sup>25</sup> chains, thence West 11<sup>66</sup> chains, thence South 66° 49' West 10<sup>43</sup> chains, thence South 80° West 4<sup>63</sup> chains, to the intersection of the center line of the street known as 4th Street, by & of the same is hereby abandoned as a County Road. Also,

Decided that all that portion of land situated lying & being within lines drawn parallel to & 49<sup>70</sup> feet on each side of the following described lands, to-wit: & of the same is hereby designated as & set apart to be a County Road, to-wit: beginning at a point 5<sup>47</sup> chains North 72° 21' West from

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August 27, 1889. Weber County Survey Monument No. 11, running thence South 20° 21' West 21<sup>00</sup> chains, thence South 46° 3' chains, thence North 89° 09' West 27<sup>00</sup> chains to the intersection of the center of the County Road previously located, leading South Westward to Helper City. The Committee on Court House Grounds were instructed to have a telephone placed in the office of the Probate Judge, provided the Judge pay one half of the rent therefor. The following claims were presented, read, allowed and ordered paid out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated to wit:

## Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 27<sup>th</sup>  
 day of August A. D. 1889 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book  
 C. on page 163 &c.) the following described road was declared to ~~be a County Road, to wit:~~ <sup>abandoned</sup>

It was resolved that all that part of the County Road leading from Ogden City westward and southwesterly to Hooper City previously located and recorded, lying and being within lines drawn parallel to and 33 feet distant on each side of the following described line, to wit:-

Beginning at a point <sup>from the State Co. S. Mond. No. 60 running</sup> 5.47 chains North  $72^{\circ}21'$  W. and 7.509 chains South  $80^{\circ}37'$  W. <sup>chain 2.90' 37'</sup> 3.461 chains, thence N.  $72^{\circ}21'$  W. 9.25 chains, thence West 74.66 chains, thence South  $66^{\circ}49'$  West 10.43 chains, thence South  $50^{\circ}$  W. 4.638 chains, to the intersection of the center line of the street known as Fourth Street, be and the same is hereby abandoned as a County Road.
