Minutes of meeting February 23rd read and approved

R. W. Harris, County Surveyor, appeared and stated that the new school district map returned by the County Court will be complicated owing to the amount of work to be placed on a map of the scale of this one. On motion of Selectman Cross the matter was referred to the Committee with Selectman Shurtliff added.

A petition signed by Parley P. Cross and 10 or other residents of Plain City and Fox West, asking this honorable body to open a road, to directly connect road near Tamm, and to be known as the Centre Road of Plain City and Fox West. Said road being described as follows, to wit: Starting at Plain City between the properties of Mrs. Raymond on the North and James Peterson on the South, running East about one and one-half miles, then North forty rods, thence East about Two Hundred and sixty rods between the properties of Mrs. Randall on the North and Mrs. Westgaard on the South. On motion of Selectman Shurtliff said petition was referred to a Committee of Five, consisting of Selectman Shurtliff and Cross, appointed by the Chair.

## RECORD OF THE COUNTY COURT OF WEBER COUNTY, UTAH TERRITORY.

May 24th 1892: The claim of T. J. Wilson for \$2750 was reduced to \$22.00<sup>and</sup> allowed.

The claim of the Fraternity Printing Co for \$750 was reduced to \$6.00<sup>and</sup> allowed.

In the matter of supplying screens for the Court House Selectman Cross reported that the screens have been ordered.

The committee on the Leasing of School Lands reported progress<sup>and</sup> asked for further time. Granted.

Selectman Cross on behalf of the committee to whom was referred the matter relative to the issuance of bonds reported that they had consulted J. M. Kimball<sup>and</sup> he advised them that the Judges of Election are appointed by the County Court; that the residents taxpayers of the County are the qualified voters; that the best means of ascertaining who are the residents taxpayers is by reference to the assessment roll; <sup>and</sup> that if persons old residents in each precinct are appointed for election judges they will know most if not all the resident taxpayers in their respective precincts <sup>and</sup> where they have any doubt upon the qualifications of a person presenting his vote they can swear<sup>and</sup> examine him as to his qualifications.

In the matter of the road leading from Fair Heat to Plain City known as Center Street, Selectman Cross submitted the following description of said road as located by the County Surveyor, <sup>and</sup> recommended that the same be declared the center line of said road, to wit: - Beginning at a point in center of the Harrisonville <sup>and</sup> Hot Springs County road 632.9 feet West of S. ## Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 15<sup>th</sup>  
 day of March A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book  
 on page 313 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

Center Street from Plain City to Farr West.  
 Starting at Plain City between the properties  
 of W<sup>m</sup> Reynolds on the north and Hans Peterson's  
 on the south, running east about one and one-  
 half miles, thence north forty rods, thence east  
 about 260 rods between the properties of W<sup>m</sup> Randall's  
 on the north and Mr. Stegeland on the south. The  
 committee recommended that above road be located  
 on condition that the right-of-way cost no more  
 than \$25<sup>00</sup>.

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Selectman Cross on behalf of the committee to whom was referred the matter relative to the issuance of bonds reported that they had consulted J. M. Kimball<sup>and</sup> he advised them that the Judges of Election are appointed by the County Court; that the residents taxpayers of the County are the qualified voters; that the best means of ascertaining who are the residents taxpayers is by reference to the assessment roll; <sup>and</sup> that if persons old residents in each precinct are appointed for election judges they will know most if not all the resident taxpayers in their respective precincts <sup>and</sup> where they have any doubt upon the qualifications of a person presenting his vote they can swear<sup>and</sup> examine him as to his qualifications.

May 24th 1892 north and south, thence N. 0° 51' E along center of County road 501 feet to County Monument No 39 Plain City. On motion of Selectman Toy the report of the committee was accepted and the recommendations adopted.

In the matter of the \$200. appropriated to defray certain expenses of the cattlemen's congress Judge Bishop reported that \$200. would not be sufficient to pay off the expenses for which it was intended and therefore he had turned the whole amount over to N. H. Turner Chairman of the Finance Committee of the Cattlemen's Congress. On motion of Selectman Cross the report of the committee was accepted.

On motion of Selectman Cross balloting to fill the vacancy existing in the office of County Attorney was postponed for one week.

On motion of Selectman Cross it was ordered that the persons whose names are set opposite the following named precincts be and they are hereby appointed Judges of the special election to be held on June 12th 1892 in and for said precincts, to wit:

## County Road Book,

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 24th day of May A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book on page 367 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

From Plain City to Farr West: (Page 179)

Selectman <sup>cross</sup> submitted the following description of said road, as located by County Surveyor; and recommends that the same be declared the center line of said road, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in center of Harrieville and Hot Springs County Road 632.9 feet West of S. E. Corner of Section 26, Township 7 N. R. 12. S. L. Meridian, U. S. Survey, which point of beginning is marked by red sand stone known and designated as County Monument No. 105, thence N.  $89^{\circ}59'$  W. (True Bear) along south line of said Section 26, 4827.2 feet to S. W. Corner thereof (Monument No. 106) thence S.  $43^{\circ}33'$  W. 870.2 feet, thence S.  $89^{\circ}55'$  W. 7549

feet to County Monument No. 107, thence N.  $88^{\circ}15'$  W. 330.2 feet, thence N.  $88^{\circ}59'$  W. 3798 feet to County Monument No. 108, thence N.  $0^{\circ}51'$  E. 734 feet, thence N.  $89^{\circ}09'$  W. 501 feet along the center of street in Plain City to Center of County Road running North and South, thence N.  $0^{\circ}51'$  E. along center of County Road, 501 feet to County Monument No. 39, Plain City. On Motion of Selectman Joy, the report was accepted and the recommendation adopted.
