

April 26th 1879. said roads in the North-east part of Henrieville be widened to correspond with the East lane in Henrieville, by the purchase of sections of Lots 5th and 6. Block 16, Plat "A" of Henrieville Survey, ^{for an amount of \$440⁰⁰} and that an appropriation of \$200⁰⁰ be made for culverts for the said roads. On motion of Selectman Cross, the report of the Committee was accepted and the recommendations adapted.

In the matter of the petition of L. V. Kelly and 46 others, the Committee was granted further time. On motion of Selectman Fry the Clerk was instructed to notify the officials of the R.R. Western Ry. Co. of the condition of the crossing on the Ogden and Hooper County roads, and to request that the same be widened and put in good and safe condition.

Selectman Cross stated that Assistant District Attorney Allison, asked that the County Surveyor be instructed to prepare a plat of the patron's ^{own} grounds where the McCallhan tragedy occurred, and move that the same be done, that the County Surveyor be instructed to report to Mr. Allison, and that the Territory pay the costs. So ordered.

H. Spencer, Theodore Robinson and R. L. Armstrong, representing the Cattlemen's Congress, appeared and asked that the County pay the expenses of entertaining the Governor, of making badges, and of printing, which they estimated, at \$200⁰⁰. On motion of Selectman Shurtliff it was ordered that \$200⁰⁰ be, and the same is hereby appropriated, and placed in the hands of A. C. Bishop, Chairman of the Finance Committee, the said \$200⁰⁰, or so much thereof as shall be necessary, to be used in the payment of

County Road Book,

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 26th
 day of April A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 on page 351 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a ~~County Road~~ ^{widened}, to-wit:

In northeast part of Huntsville:—
 The petition of David McKay et al, asking

 appropriation of \$20⁰⁰ be made for culverts for
 the said road, was read and upon Motion of
 Salletman Shurtliff said petition was
 granted.
