Then a M. Court met pursuant to adjournment.

Minutes of the meeting of May 3<sup>rd</sup> read and approved.

In the matter of the communication from Samuel Dye relative to the bill of George A. Lowe for \$2.00 which had been disallowed the goods having been delivered on the order of Samuel Dye and not authorized by the court, Selectman Shurtliff recommended that the said bill be allowed. On motion of Selectman Cross the recommendations of the committee were adopted.

In the matter of the petition of Fred Aschlemann, Selectman Shurtliff recommended that the road leading from Ogden to Uintah be changed in accordance with the former action of the Court as follows:— Beginning at a point in the center of said road 1354 feet south of the center of section 22 Township 5 North Range 1 West of the Salt Lake Meridian, thence south 89° 40' East 590 feet, thence south 13° 10' East 200 feet to center of said road thence South 47° 10' East along the center of said road.

On motion of Selectman Foy it was ordered that the recommendations of the committee be, and the same are hereby adopted.

On motion of selectmen Cross it was ordered that it be the sense of the Court that in the event of the question of bonding Weber County receiving a favorable consideration at the hands of the people on June 1st. \$70,000 in bonds be sold, that amount being sufficient to <sup>pay</sup> pay all outstanding indebtedness and to make necessary improvements.

Selectman Foy recommended that the report of Willard Cragun be inspector, for the year 1891, be approved. On motion of Selectman

## County Road Book,

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 10<sup>th</sup>  
 day of May A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book  
 on page 258 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a ~~County Road~~<sup>change</sup>, to-wit:

From Ogden to Uintah; (Page 183).

Beginning at a point in the center of  
 said road 135<sup>+</sup> feet south of the center of Section  
 22, Township 5, North Range 1, West of Salt Lake  
 Meridian, thence south  $89^{\circ}40'$  East 590 feet  
 thence South  $13^{\circ}10'$  East 200 feet to center of said  
 road, thence South  $47^{\circ}10'$  East, along the center  
 of said road.

## Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 19<sup>th</sup>  
 day of April A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book  
 on page 345 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

Alex Leschleman of Uintah petitioned the Court to be allowed to change the road on the bench north of Uintah about one or two rods further north. A communication from Samuel Tye, Road Supervisor of Uintah Road, urging that the above change be permitted was read. On Motion of Subbetman Tye, the petition was granted, provided the petitioner pay for surveying.

April 19<sup>th</sup> 1892. on the note for \$1,000, held by the Ogden State Bank against Weber County.

Geo. Ackerman, of Monticello, petitioned the Honorable County to be allowed to change the roads on the bench North of Monticello, stating that it would be quite a favor to him, as he can fence a nice piece of land in by changing the roads only about one or two rods further North, and will be no detriment to the road whatever. A communication from James H. Hays, road supervisor of the Monticello roads saying that the above change he permitted was made. On motion of Selection Hays, it was ordered that said petition be, and the same is hereby granted, provided that the said petitioner pay the expenses of surveying.

Selection Cross reported that the deed of John Ekins and wife to Weber County for right of way through his property for the road leading North from the West Stakey bridge, is in proper form and properly executed, and recommended that the same be accepted, and that an appropriation of \$250.00 be made to John Ekins in payment thereof, in accordance with the former action of the County. On motion it was ordered that the report of the Committee be accepted, and the recommendations adopted.

The following resolution was presented, and in motion of Selection Sheriff, unanimously adopted:
