

May 17th 1892 John Eberville ^{and} 15 other non-resident property owners in Eden, expressing their sincere ^{and} solicited wish that the County bonds will be voted by the people on June 1st. ^{and} petition was read ^{and} ordered filed. The County clerk submitted his monthly report for the month of April showing total expenditures for the month of \$2694.50 ^{and} a total from Jan 1st to April 30th of \$25,036.45 Ordered filed. Ethen McBride appeared ^{and} offered to allow the road leading to the mouth of Middle Fork Canon to pass through his property ^{and} to fence the same for a distance of 160 rods for the sum of \$100.00. No action.

Selectman Shurtliff reported progress on the work being done on the Middle Fork Road. The six men employed will have the road in good condition by Saturday night.

In the matter of the petition of L. G. Felt Et al relative to the changing of the road from Huntville to Middle Fork Canon through the property of C. D. Wood. Selectman Shurtliff recommended that the said road be changed ^{and} located as follows:— Beginning at a point situated N 1° 40' W 6785.46 feet from County Monument No 99, thence North 29° 17' E 2136 feet to Quarter Corner 6/5 Th. 6 N. R 2 E. Salt Lake Meridian, N. S. Survey thence North 1° 13' East along section line 3340 feet to the intersection of the traveled road leading from Eden to Middle Fork Canon. On motion of Selectman Cross it was ordered that the report of the committee be accepted ^{and} the recommendations adopted.

In the matter of the petition of James M. Farland et al the committee was granted further time.

In the matter of purchasing screens for the Court House the committee reported progress ^{and} asked for further time. Granted. On motion of Selectman Shurtliff Selectman Cross was authorized to have sewer connections made with the Court House, at once, ^{and} to have the necessary plumbing done.

Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 17th day of May A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book 4 on page 363 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

From Huntsville to Middle Fork:—

In the matter of the petition of L. V. Felt et al, relative to changing of the road from Huntsville to Middle Fork Canyon, through the property of C. S. Wood, Selectman Shurtliff recommended the following, that said road be changed and located as follows:—

Beginning at a point situated N. $1^{\circ} 40' 30''$ W. 6785.46 feet from County Monument No. 99, thence North $29^{\circ} 17'$ E. 2136 feet to Quarter Corner $\frac{1}{4}$ Th. 6 N. R. 2 E. Salt Lake Meridian, U. S. Survey, thence north $1^{\circ} 13'$ East along Section Line 3340 feet to the intersection of the traveled road leading from Eden to Middle Fork Canyon. Upon motion of Cross, the recommendation was accepted and adopted.

Minutes of the meeting of April 26th read and approved.

Joseph Hinkle, Sr., P. P. Peterson and Natham Kimball petitioned the Court to improve the road leading from West Weber to Kanabville. Referred to Selectman Foy.

The monthly report of John Patterson Superintendent of the Coon Farm for the month of April was submitted and approved by the Court.

The annual report of J. D. Powell road supervisor of the Marriette road district was submitted and referred to Selectman Cross.

The annual report of William Cragan, Dec. Inspector, for the year 1891, was submitted and referred to Selectman Foy.

In the matter of the petition of L. F. Fell and 47 others Selectman Shurtliff recommended that the same be denied, but that a road be located as follows:— Beginning at Hood's Park and running thence North on the section line between sections 5 & 6 Township 6 North, Range 2 East to the intersection of the Eden road, and thence in a northerly direction to the West line of Ether McBrider's property. On motion of Selectman Foy the report of the committee was accepted and the recommendations adopted. Selectman Shurtliff reported progress in the matter of the opening up of the Middle Fork road. He had authorized J. S. Ferrin to employ five or six men to make improvements on the dugway and other parts of the road.

In the matter of the petition of James McFarland and 19 others

In the matter of the petition of L. V. Felt and

 follows:—

Beginning at Wood's Bars and running
 thence north on the Section Line between Sections
 5+6, Township 6 North of Range 2 East to the
 intersection of the Eden road, and thence in a
 northerly direction to the west line of Ether Mc-
 Bride's property.
