June 14th Sheriff with power to act.

On motion of Selectman Fay an additional appropriation of \$35 was made to Joseph S. Perry, County Superintendent of Schools, to defray the expenses of the County School commencement exercises.

Edwin Dix, County Assessor, submitted the census returns as far as completed up to the time of the repealing of the law requiring that assessors take the census annually, which shows as follows:— Ogden City 18876; Plain City 1035; Hooper 1060.

Mr. Dix also submitted his statistical report as far as completed up to the time of the repealing of the law requiring assessors to compile said statistics. The reports of the assessor were accepted.
