Selectman Swanson on behalf of the committee recommended that the petition of Cynthia Bingham that she be awarded damages sufficient to reimburse her for the expense of moving fences which was necessitated by the opening of the road leading southward from the "First Weber bridge" be denied. On motion the recommendation was adopted.

In the matter of the petition of A. H. Tracy et al for the opening of a road, heretofore granted, Selectman Swanson submitted the following as the official survey and description of said road, and recommended that the same be accepted, to wit:—

Description of County Road 4 rods wide leading from the South-East Corner of Section 26 Township 6 N. Range 21. N. S. 4. Meridian North to a 4 rod road leading through Wilson District.

Beginning at County Monument No. 139 situated at the South-East corner of said section 26, and in center of County Road leading West through Buttermilk Slough. Bearings from said Monument are, to Ben Hammond N. 18° 13' W. along east line of Section 26, 3370 ⁵/₁₀ feet to red sand stone known as Weber County Survey Mon. No 140. Situated in center of Co Road leading through Wilson District.

County Road Book,

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 21st
 day of July A. D. 1892 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 on page 255 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

To a road leading through Wilson Dist. -
 Beginning at the County Monument No.
 139, situated at the southeast corner of said Sec.
 76, and in the center of the County Road leading west
 through Buttermilk Slough. Bearings from said
 Monument are to Ben Lomond Peak N. 18° 3' W.
 along east line of Section 76, 3370.5 ft. to red
 sandstone known as Weber County Survey Monument
 No. 100, situated in the center of County Road
 leading through Wilson District.
