

## RECORD OF THE COUNTY COURT OF WEBER COUNTY, UTAH TERRITORY.

Nov 6th 1893

and n. Block 3. Durms Addition to Ogden. That after the expiration of the two years in which the said property could be redeemed a tax deed was issued to said Woods, but that prior to the expiration of said two years a redemption certificate to said property was issued by the County Treasurer, but the said redemption certificate was not placed on records in the County Recorder's office until after the said deed was recorded. An adjustment of the matter was asked for. Referred to Judge Bishop and the County Attorney.

A Sherburne complained to the Court that he is assessed with \$150 personal property though he is a non-resident and not the owner of any personal property in Weber County. Referred to Judge Bishop.

Brainard and Rifter complained that part of Lot 6 and all of Lot 7, P. 7, Hoodman's Main St. Addition was sold for taxes of 1892 whereas only the west 30 feet of said lot 7 should have been sold, as the taxes on the east 60 feet of Lot 7 were paid. Referred to Judge Bishop.

On motion of Selectman Swanson, a warrant in the sum of \$250 was ordered drawn in favor of Joseph Hubbard for 2000 ft of land for right of way for the road leading from Plain City towards the Hot Springs.

Selectman Swanson submitted the following as the reserves of the road heretofore surveyed and located leading from Plain City towards the Hot Springs, and on motion

Nov. 6th 1893. The same was adopted and the said road was changed to correspond with said resurvey, to wit: Beginning at County survey Monument No. 136, thence South 99° 54' East 10554 ft. to County Survey Monument No. 137. The survey of the above road between Mon. No. 136 + 137, June 15th 1893 is abandoned, and occupied by the above description, changed by order of the County Court Sept 20th. 1893.

Selectman Haugsgard reported that the work of repairing the road in Weber Canon is completed, and that a good road has been made on the solid rock.

Selectman Haugsgard recommended that \$100. be expended on the Ogden Canon road at a point above Hinshaw's where some blasting is necessary. The recommendation was adopted.

Selectman Shurtliff in behalf of the tramway committee, reported that the work on the North Ogden road is completed, and he recommended that the tramway proceed to gravel the Hazenville road. The recommendation was adopted.

Peter B. Peterson complained that 80 acres of land in N. 1/4, Sec. 4, T. 3, R. 2, is assessed with \$400. in improvements, which said improvements he claims do not exist. Referred to Judge Bishop.

Selectman Shurtliff was appointed a committee to look into the matter of recovering the costs of holding inquests and burial expenses in the case of Theodor Busch, deceased.

## Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 6<sup>th</sup>  
 day of November A. D. 1893 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book  
9 on page 421 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, <sup>resurvey of</sup> to-wit:

Road from Plain City to Hot Springs:-  
 Beginning at County Survey Monument No.  
 136, thence south  $89^{\circ}54'$  East 10554 ft to  
 County Survey Monument No. 137. The survey of  
 the above road between Monuments 136+137, June  
 15<sup>th</sup> 1893, (Page 193) is abandoned, and occupied  
 by the above description. Changed by Order of The  
 County Court Sept. 20, 1893.
