

Record of the County Court of Weber County, Utah.

Nov 28th 1896 commencing January 4th, 1897.

A petition signed by Mr. N. L. Sussinger and 10 others praying for the appointment of Charles Sussinger as Justice of the Peace for the Fifth Ogden Precinct, was read.

After due consideration it was ordered, on motion of Commissioner Child, that Charles Sussinger be appointed Justice of the Peace for said Precinct, for the term commencing January 4th, 1897, over Arthur Braddish, who declined to qualify.

On motion of Commissioner Child, it was ordered that the Board of Education of Ogden City, Utah, be requested to refund the sum of \$592.25 and to issue the same to the County Treasurer, the said sum being the amount of County School tax illegally collected by the County Collector of Weber County and turned over to said Board of Education.

It was ordered that County roads be established in the Warren District. Provided the said rights of way without expense or cost to the County, the said roads to be four rods in width, and the center line of which are described as follows, to wit:

1. Beginning at the Northwest corner of the S. 1/4 Sec. 12, T. 6 N., R. 3 W., and running thence North one section less 3/4 mile, as per map filed to the State Salt Lake.
2. Beginning at the Southern corner of Section 12, T. 6 N., R. 3 W., and running thence South one section less one rod, and then West one section less one rod, and then North one section less one rod, as per map filed to the State Salt Lake.
3. Beginning at the Northeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of

Sec. 12 - 1/4 Sec. 12, T. 6 N., R. 3 W., and running thence North one section less 3/4 mile, as per map filed to the State Salt Lake.

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4. Beginning at the Northwest corner of the SW 1/4 of Section 11, T. 6 N., R. 3 W., and running thence North one quarter section lines (and extending two rods on each side thereof) 3 3/8 miles or more to Great Salt Lake.
 5. Beginning at the Northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of Section 12, T. 6 N., R. 3 W., and running thence North one quarter section lines (and extending two rods on each side thereof) 5 3/8 miles or more to Great Salt Lake.
 6. Beginning at the center of the West side of Weber Bridge (said Bridge being situated in the N. 1/4 of section 19, T. 6 N., R. 2 W.) and running thence N. 61° 56' W. to the west line said section 19 thence N. 61° 56' W. 180 feet, thence N. 65° 16' West 728 2/3 feet to the North line of sec 24 T. 6 N. R. 3 W. thence West 7 miles or more to Great Salt Lake, and extending 2 rods on each side thereof.
 7. Beginning at the N. E. cor. of Section 13 T. 6 N. R. 3 W. and running thence South one section line (and extending 2 rods on each side thereof) 1/2 mile, more or less, thence South 12° 24' E. 670 feet thence South 0° 19' E. 2598 feet, to the intersection of roads described as above.

The following claims were read and after due consideration the same were rejected, to wit: S. P. Ault \$25 for medical services for sick person during travel of Isaac, et al; J. P. Shanon \$30.00 for charges for charges on account of Robert Francis; and H. B. Ekin \$10.00 for 30 packages of straw and for damages to horses for running same.

The claims of Wm. H. Wall of \$30.00, and \$2.25; and S. J. Giffert \$25, were allowed and ordered paid.

Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 28th
 day of December A. D. 1896 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 on page 338 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

In Warren:—

Beginning at the Northwest Corner of the
 Southwest Quarter of Section 11 T. 6. N. R. 3. West,
 and running thence south on Section Lines
 and extending two rods on each side thereof $3\frac{5}{8}$
 miles, more or less, to Great Salt Lake.
