

Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 24th day of December A. D. 1849 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book N on page 212 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

The following communication from the Adams Nursery Company was received and read to-wit:-
 To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Weber County:-
 The undersigned citizens of Weber County and residents in the vicinity of the present western terminus of 24th St. in Ogden City Utah, would respectfully petition your honorable body to lay out and open a public road commencing at the center of the present terminus of 24th St. in Ogden City and running thence west about 200 ft. to a point about 800 ft. east of the R. D. St. R.R. The road to be 66 ft. wide. That said road would be of public benefit and is on practical ground and inexpensive to open and keep in repair, and that the county will not be required to bear the expense of opening said road.

The petition was ordered filed and on motion of Commissioner E. Keen, it was unanimously ordered that said petition be and the same is hereby granted, contingent upon said Nursery Company bearing all the expense incident to opening of said road.
