

Weber County, Utah.

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 3rd day of February A. D. 1902 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book on page 39 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

The following resolution was adopted by a vote of all members of the Board present, to-wit:—
 It whereas it is necessary for the convenience of the taxpayers, residents, and public generally, to survey, view, lay out, record, open, maintain and work a public highway, in Weber County, Utah, leading from Plain City Precinct to West Weber Precinct, and running through sections 5 and 8 in Township 6 North of Range 2 west, and over and through the lands hereinafter described and to hereafter locate a steel wagon bridge over the Weber River at the point where said proposed road would cross such river, therefore,

Be It Resolved, that said highway, the center line of which is particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 33 feet east from the southwest corner of the southeast quarter of Section 8, said Township and Range; thence north $0^{\circ}34\frac{1}{2}'$ east, 5497.5 feet; thence north $13^{\circ}37.5'$ west 1257.2 feet; thence north $0^{\circ}50'$ east 1104.8 feet to the southwest corner of the southeast quarter of Section 5, said Township and Range, (across the southwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 8, the roadway is only 50 ft., the balance of the way will be a four-rod or 66 foot roadway), be and the same is hereby laid out, opened and forever abandoned and dedicated to the use of the public as a public highway.
