

At a session of the County Court of Weber County, in the Territory of Utah, held on the 19th
 day of May A. D. 1902 (the minutes of the proceedings of which are recorded in County Book
 on page 176 &c.) the following described road was declared to be a County Road, to-wit:

Commissioner Steen submitted the following resolution and moved its adoption and the same was unanimously adopted, to-wit:-

1st That in order to straighten and improve a portion of a now existing County road, the center line of which said portion is described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the Section Line in the center of said existing County road (which portion it is proposed to abandon, the center line of which is hereinafter described) South $89^{\circ} 34'$ East 63 feet from the southwest corner of the southeast quarter of Section 32, Township 7 North of Range 2 West, S. L. M., thence South $89^{\circ} 32'$ East 79 feet, thence North $6^{\circ} 5'$ East 373 feet to a point of intersection of the east line of the said proposed change, be and the same is hereby forever abandoned as a public highway.

2nd That a highway 4 rods in width, the center line of which is particularly described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the center of the present County road at a point 83.5 ft. south from the northwest corner of the northeast quarter of said section 5, Township 6, North Range 2 West, S. L. M.; thence North $19^{\circ} 28'$ East 580 ft. to a point in the center of the present County road, be and the same is hereby laid out, opened and forever abandoned and dedicated to the use of the public as a public highway.
