

During the calendar year 1966, the State Highway Department completed extensive construction work on Highway U-111 (12300 between State Street and Redwood Road 1700 West). About one mile of this work involved a realignment of the State Highway. Approximately two blocks of a north-south road at 1300 West and perhaps six blocks of the old east-west road are no longer traveled extensively by other than adjacent property owners.

This road has been deleted from the Maintenance responsibilities of the State Highway Department. It may be desirable to make a joint field inspection to determine if there are any questions or problems that could be handled by this method. There do not appear to be any permits or similar documents issued to private individuals for utility connections.

The records of the Highway Department will be adjusted to the end that the above mentioned sections of road are included in the County B & C accounts and appropriate funds authorized for maintenance.


