WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide adequate access from Interstate Route 15 to Farmington from the south and from the north and,

WHEREAS, to maintain continuity in the State System of Highways.


NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority of Section 27-12-27, UCA, 1953, AS APPENDED it is hereby resolved as follows:

- 1. That State Route 225 be added as interim designation from a connection with the interchange of Interstate Route 15 and US-89, State Route 49 east via Burke Lane to State Route 106 in Farmington.
- 2. That State Route 227 be added as a interim designation from Interstate Route 15, near Glover Lane north via Walker Lane to State Street, thence east via State Street to State Route 106 in Farmington.
- 3. That application be made to U. S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Public Roads, to add the proposed State Routes 225 and 227 to the Federal-aid System of Highways.
- 4. That by this action State and Federal-aid System mileage will be increased 2.5 + - miles.
- 5. That Exhibit "A" attached herewith illustrating the action taken herewith is hereby incorporated as a part of this submission. day of November, 1964. Dated this

RESOLUTION

Alignment - Relocation Addition to the State Highway System SR-225 Davis County

WHEREAS, Section 72-4-104 of the Utah State Code 1998, Providing for the Disposition of portion of highways re-aligned, and Section 72-4-102 of the Utah State Code 1999, Providing for the Addition to state highway system – Designation of highways as state highways between sessions, and

WHEREAS, the completion of a newly constructed interchange in conjunction with Project No. SP-9999(638) which provides new connections with SR-225, I-15, US-89 and SR-106 replacing the old interchange known as Lagoon – Burke Lane Interchange. And along with realigned roadway to inhabit a portion of SR-225 creating characteristic changes to the State System of Highways, and

WHEREAS, in the completion of a connection segment of roadway, the Region One Director recommends that the new constructed portion of highway be added to the State Highway System as a portion of SR-225, and


WHEREAS, state constructed frontage, and access roads in conjunction with Project No. SP-9999(638) providing connections to local streets and having occurred within the boundaries of Farmington City, the duly appointed officials of Farmington City having been notified of the foregoing designations, concur with the ascribed designations defined herein, and

WHEREAS, the Systems Planning and Programming Division, concurs with the recommendation of the Region One Director, Adding a portion of road in association with Project No. SP-9999(638) defined herein.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The addition of SR-225 designation will be added as a state route when Project No. SP-9999(638) is completed and open to traffic from a Jct. with Clark Lane (100 North) in Farmington to a Jct. with SR-106 in Farmington and the functional class will be Minor Arterial the entire distance of the route.
- 2. The aforementioned roadway will be incorporated as a portion on SR-225 a distance of $1.274 \pm \text{miles}$, thus adding $0.751 \pm \text{miles}$ to the State Highway System, thus providing the connection between Clark Lane (100 North) and SR-106, and thus will henceforth be described as follows.

(SR-225) From Clark Lane via Park Lane to Route 106 in Farmington.



RESOLUTION

<u>Deletion of Portion SR-225 from State Highway System</u> <u>Transfer to Farmington City</u> <u>Davis County</u>

WHEREAS, Section 72-4-102 of the Utah State Code provides for "Additions to or deletions from the state highway system – Designation of Highways as state highways between sessions"; and,

WHEREAS, the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) and Farmington City have agreed to the transfer of maintenance and jurisdictional responsibilities of a portion of roadway known as SR-225 (Park Lane) in Farmington, beginning at the south, ending at the south west limit of the structure over the Union Pacific Railroad tracks, as shown in Exhibit A; and,

WHEREAS, the UDOT and Farmington City have entered into a cooperative agreement for snow removal; and,

WHEREAS, the UDOT Region One Director, along with Systems Planning and Programming and the duly appointed officials of Farmington City, concur with the request to transfer maintenance and jurisdictional responsibilities to Farmington City for the transferred road described herein.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. A portion of roadway known as SR-225, from Clark Lane via Park Lane to the west end of structure above the Union Pacific Railroad a distance of approximately 0.52 ± miles, be deleted from the State Highway System and transferred to the jurisdiction and maintenance responsibility of Farmington City.
- The afore mentioned transferred roadway will remain functionally classified as Minor Arterial and be placed on the Federal Aid Route System as Route 1427 adding 0.52 ± miles to Farmington Cities road system.
- 3. SR-225 will now be described as follows: From the west side of the structure over the Union Pacific Railroad easterly via Park Lane to Route 106 in Farmington.
- 4. The Utah Department of Transportation and Farmington City have entered into a cooperative agreement where it is written to set the terms and conditions for snow removal and maintenance of the structure above the Union Pacific Rail Road tracks under which the jurisdictional transfer shall be performed.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT, made and entered into this ______ day of ______, 20___, by and between the UTAH DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, hereinafter referred to as "UDOT" and FARMINGTON CITY, a municipal corporation of the State of Utah, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY",

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, Section 72-4-102 of the Utah State Code provides for "Additions to or deletions from the state highway system – Designation of Highways as state highways between sessions"; and

WHEREAS, the UDOT and the CITY have agreed to the transfer of maintenance and jurisdictional responsibilities of a portion of roadway known as SR-225 (Park Lane) in Farmington, beginning at the south, and ending at the south west limit of the structure over the Union Pacific Railroad tracks, as shown in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the UDOT Region One Director, along with Systems Planning and Programming and the duly appointed officials of the CITY, concur with the request to transfer maintenance and jurisdictional responsibilities to the CITY for the transferred road described herein.

THIS COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT is made to set out the terms and conditions whereunder said work shall be performed.

NOW THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- 1. A portion of roadway known as SR-225, a distance of approximately 0.52 miles, be deleted from the state highway system and transferred to the jurisdiction and maintenance responsibility of the CITY upon passage of the Utah Transportation Commission, and be added to the CITY's roadway system as Park Lane.
- 2. The CITY agrees to provide snow removal for the structure over the Union Pacific Railroad tracks. All other operations and maintenance responsibilities, services, needs, and costs become the sole responsibility of the CITY effective upon the execution of the jurisdictional transfer.
- 3. Park Lane when assumed by the **CITY** will be maintained to carry the same amount of traffic and meet the intent and purpose of the existing facility.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused these presents to be executed by their duly authorized officers as of the day and year first above-written.
