WHEREAS, Section 63-11-20, Utah Code Annotated, 1953, as amended, relates that: "All roads connecting state parks with federal, state or county highways or city streets where the title hereto is in the state are parts of the state highway system and are to be maintained by the state. The Utah Transportation Commission is authorized to construct and maintain roads within state parks subject to approval of locations and design by the commission through its director", and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Utah Transportation Commission and the Utah State Division of Parks and Recreation to define responsibility for the administration of roads at state parks, and

WHEREAS, it is agreed between the Utah Transportation Commission and the State Division of Parks and Recreation that certain roads meet the criteria set forth in Section 63-11-20, UCA, 1953, as amended, and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended by the San Juan County Commission and concurred in by James L. Deaton, District #4 Engineer, that the roadway from the Great Goosenecks of the San Juan State Park to State Route 261 be designated as a State Route, and

WHEREAS, the principal function of this roadway is to provide access to the State Park, and

WHEREAS, this is a state park of some significence as evidenced by over twenty-two thousand visitors during the fiscal year 1974, and

WHEREAS, those roads at state parks that are part of the State System of Highways should be identified by a number.

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with Section 63-11-20, UCA, 1953, as amended, it is hereby resolved as follows:

SUBJECT:

Access Road to Goosenecks State Park

I am in receipt of your memorandum, April 7, 1975, requesting comments relative to the access road to the Goosenecks State Park being added to the State System, further, I have read Lester R. Jester's memorandum and recommendations.

In past years, various access roads have been added to the state system that probably has set precedence for additions to the state system. I believe it would be in the public interest if the Commission adopted a policy which would consider some of the following: (1) Sanitary facilities; (2) Drinking Water; (3) Number of Visitors; (4) If Manned by the Responsible Agency; (5) The primary use of the addition; before access roads to parks or senic attractions are added to the system.

Without a policy as a guide, I am recommending that the captioned access road be added to the State System for the only reason that the primary use is for access to a state park.


The County has improved this road to a paved standard, and it is presently in good condition.


